## POLICE

**Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment) Regulations 1992**

*Made* . . . . . 29th September 1992

*Coming into operation* . . . . . 1st December 1992

*To be laid before Parliament*

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), and after consulting in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority and the Police Association, and after taking into account the recommendations made by the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing that board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(c), hereby with the concurrence of the Treasury makes the following regulations:—

*Citation, operation and effect*

**1.**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment) Regulations 1992.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on 1st December 1992 but shall have effect for the purposes of regulation 5 as from 19th March 1991, for the purposes of regulation 7 as from 30th June 1991, and for the purposes of regulations 8 and 9 as from 31st August 1991

Provided that regulation 43 of the principal regulations shall continue to apply as it had effect immediately before the coming into operation of these regulations in relation to any move which took place before 20th March 1991.

*Interpretation*

**2.** In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984(d).

*Business interests incompatible with membership of the force*

**3.**—(1) In paragraph (2) of regulation 8 of the principal regulations after the word “and” there shall be inserted the words “, within 28 days of the receipt of that notice,”.

(2) There shall be substituted for paragraph (3A) of that regulation the following paragraph—

“(3A) On receipt of a notice given under paragraph (3) the Police Authority shall require the chief constable to submit to them, within the next following 10 days, a notice setting out the reasons for his decision and copies of any documents on which he relies in support of that decision; and the Police Authority shall send to the member concerned copies of such notice and documents and shall afford him a reasonable opportunity, being in no case less than 14 days, to comment thereon.”.

(3) In paragraph (4) of that regulation after the word “shall” in the first place where it occurs there shall be inserted the words “, within 28 days of receiving his comments on the notice and any other documents submitted by the chief constable under paragraph (3A) or of the expiration of the period afforded for making comments if none have by then been received,”.

#### *Advances of pay*

4. In regulation 37 of the principal regulations there shall be added after paragraph (2) the following paragraph—

“(3) The Police Authority may, if they think fit, pay to a member such part of his pay as they may determine in advance of the day on which it would otherwise be due to be paid in accordance with this regulation.”.

#### *Removal allowance*

5.—(1) In paragraph (1)(d) of regulation 43 of the principal regulations for the word “13” there shall be substituted the word “26” and for the words “a further period not exceeding 39 weeks” there shall be substituted the words “such further period as they may determine”.

(2) In paragraph (7) of that regulation for the words “£600” there shall be substituted the words “£1,200”.

(3) In paragraph (9)(b) of that regulation there shall be inserted after the word “fees” the words “, stamp duty” and after the word “mortgage” there shall be inserted the words “and any reference to expenses incurred in connection with the acquisition of any property shall be construed as also including expenses in connection with the contemplated acquisition of a property other than that acquired”.

#### *Allowance in respect of medical charges*

6. There shall be substituted for regulation 54 of the principal regulations the following regulation—

“54.—(1) A member, other than one such as is mentioned in paragraph (2), shall be reimbursed the normal standard charges incurred in his case under Articles 5, 61, 62, 63 and 98 of the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1972(a) (which Articles relate to charges for certain drugs, medicines and appliances and for dental treatment).

(2) A member who first became a member on or after 1st December 1992 shall be reimbursed any such charges if they are incurred by reason of an injury received without the default of the member concerned in the execution of his duty as a member, but not otherwise.

(3) For the purposes of the preceding paragraph, the terms "injury", "injury received in the execution of duty" and "without the default of the member concerned" have the same meanings as they have in the Royal Ulster Constabulary Pensions Regulations(a)."

#### *University scholars*

7. Paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 4 to the principal regulations shall have effect as if for "£1,269" there were substituted "£1,344".

#### *Pay*

8. In Schedule 5 to the principal regulations for the Tables A, B and C there shall be substituted respectively the Tables set out in the Schedule.

#### *Dog handler's allowance*

9. In Schedule 11 to the principal regulations in sub-paragraph 1(1)(a) for "£792" there shall be substituted "£858" and in sub-paragraph 1(1)(b) for "£1,083" there shall be substituted "£1,176".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984 (the principal regulations).

Regulation 3 amends regulation 8 of the principal regulations. It makes additional provision in relation to appeals against decisions concerning the compatibility of business interests with membership of the force.

Regulation 4 enables the Police Authority to make advances of pay to members of the force.

Regulation 5 amends regulation 43 (removal allowance) of the principal regulations so as to increase eligibility for the reimbursement of mortgage interest or rent, increase the maximum amount payable in respect of incidental expenditure and clarify the meaning of certain reimbursable expenses. The amendments apply only to moves which took place on or after 20th March 1991. (For technical legal reasons the amendments are stated in regulation 1(2) to have effect as from 19th March 1991.).

Regulation 6 amends the principal regulations to provide for the reimbursement of National Health Service charges for certain drugs, medicines and appliances and for dental treatment to officers who joined the force on or after 1st December 1992 but only where such charges have been incurred as a result of an injury received or disease contracted in the execution of their police duties. The entitlement to reimbursement of all such charges irrespective of how they were incurred has been preserved for officers who joined the force before that date.

Regulation 7 increases the supplementary pay allowance for university scholars and has effect as from 1st July 1991. (For technical legal reasons the date specified in the regulation is 30th June 1991.).

Regulation 8 increases the rate of pay for members of the force and regulation 9 increases the dog handler's allowance. Both regulations have effect as from 1st September 1991. (For technical legal reasons the date specified in the regulations is 31st August 1991.).

Retrospection is authorised by section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962.
