ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

One-Way Traffic (Ballyclare) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1993

Made 2nd June 1993

Coming into operation 19th July 1993

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS 3 representations have been received and duly considered;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Ballyclare) Order (Northern Ireland) 1993 and shall come into operation on 19th July 1993.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on The Square, Ballyclare, other than in a clockwise direction.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order introduces a one-way traffic system in The Square, Ballyclare.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
