ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Control of Traffic (Lisburn) Order  
(Northern Ireland) 1994

Made . . . . . 11th April 1994

Coming into operation . . . . . 23rd May 1994

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection or representation has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Order:

*Citation and commencement*

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Lisburn) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 23rd May 1994.

*Prohibition of right-hand turn*

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit a vehicle travelling in a northerly direction along Antrim Road, Lisburn, to make a right-hand turn into Clonevin Park.

*(This note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order prohibits vehicles travelling in a northerly direction along Antrim Road, Lisburn, from making a right-hand turn into Clonevin Park.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
