**Angling (Department of Agriculture Waters)
(Amendment No. 2) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1994**

Made 8th August 1994

Coming into operation 13th September 1994

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 26(1)(a) of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Agriculture, hereby makes the following Byelaws:

Citation and commencement

1. These Byelaws may be cited as the Angling (Department of Agriculture Waters) (Amendment No. 2) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 13th September 1994.

Amendment of the Angling (Department of Agriculture Waters) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1989

2. The Angling (Department of Agriculture Waters) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1989(c) shall be amended as provided in Byelaws 3 to 7.

Interpretation

3. In Byelaw 3 after the definition of "earthworm" there shall be inserted the following definition—

"float tube" means any device or apparatus designed to hold a person vertical in the water.

Restrictions on the use of boats

4. In Byelaw 8 for the words "Lough Glenreawan" there shall be substituted "Lough Glencreawan".

5. In Byelaw 9 after the word "boats" there shall be inserted the words "other than electrically powered boats".

Prohibition on the use of float tubes

6. After Byelaw 9 there shall be inserted—

“9A. Float tubes shall not be used for the purpose of angling on the waters to which these Byelaws apply.”

Permitted methods of angling

7. In the Schedule—

(a) for the entry relating to the Carey River in the first column (“Department of Agriculture Waters”) there shall be substituted—

“That portion of the Carey River from its confluence with the Glenshesk River upstream to Ballyvoy Bridge”;

(b) for the entry relating to Glenshesk River in the first column there shall be substituted—

“That portion of the Glenshesk River from its confluence with the Carey River upstream to Glenshesk Bridge”;

(c) for the entry relating to the Marcy River in the first column there shall be substituted—

“Margy River”;

(d) for the entry relating to Lough Glencreawan in the second column (“Methods of Angling”) for the words “From the shore fly fishing, spinning and worm fishing. From boats fly fishing only” there shall be substituted—

“Fly fishing”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Byelaws.)

These Byelaws amend the Angling (Department of Agriculture Waters) Byelaws 1989 as follows:—

1. Byelaw 3 adds a definition of “float tubes”.
2. Byelaw 4 corrects the spelling of Lough Glencreawan.
3. Byelaw 5 permits the use of electrically powered boats on specified waters.
4. Byelaw 6 prohibits the use of float tubes on waters to which the Byelaws apply.
5. Byelaw 7 amends the Schedule:—
 - (a) to redefine the portions of the Carey River and the Glenshesk River to which the Byelaws apply;
 - (b) to correct the spelling of Margy River; and
 - (c) to make fly fishing the only permitted method of angling on Lough Glencreawan.
