## ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

**Traffic Weight Restriction (Fergy's Bridge, Route U8047, Markethill) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994***Made* . . . . . 14th October 1994*Coming into operation* . . . . . 25th November 1994

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS one representation has been received and duly considered;

NOW THEREFORE the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 22(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and being satisfied that the road specified in Article 2 is unsuitable for use by certain classes of vehicles makes the following Order:

*Citation, commencement and interpretation*

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Traffic Weight Restriction (Fergy's Bridge, Route U8047, Markethill) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 25th November 1994.

(2) In this Order "maximum gross weight" has the meaning assigned to that term by regulation 2(1) of the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1989(b).

*Prohibition*

2. The use by vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes maximum gross weight is prohibited on Fergy's Bridge, Route U8047, Markethill.

This Order prohibits vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes maximum gross weight from using Fergy's Bridge, Route U8047, Markethill.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
