# The Health and Social Services Trusts (Exercise of Functions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1994

Made Ist March 1994
Coming into operation Ist April 1994

The Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 3(2) of the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1994(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

# Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health and Social Services Trusts (Exercise of Functions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1994.
- (2) In these Regulations, "the Order" means the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1994.

# Relevant functions of Health and Social Services Boards

2. The relevant functions of a Health and Social Services Board under the statutory provisions specified in column 1 of the Schedule are those functions specified in column 2 of the Schedule for the purposes of Article 3 of the Order.

# Health and Personal Social Services EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations prescribe functions of a Health and Social Services Board under certain statutory provisions as "relevant functions" for the purposes of Article 3 of the Health and Personal Social Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1994 (the Order). The functions specified include functions placed directly on a Board by the statutory provision and functions exercisable by a Board on behalf of the Department of Health and Social Services.

Article 3 of the Order enables a Board, with the Department's approval, to delegate the exercise of the prescribed functions to a Health and Social Services trust.
