SLAUGHTER-HOUSES

The Slaughter-houses (Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1996

Made--2nd May 1996Coming into operation3rd May 1996

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 1(1), 5 and 11(1) of the Slaughter-houses Act (Northern Ireland) 1953(1) hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Slaughter-houses (Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1996 and shall come into operation on 3rd May 1996.

Amendment of the licensing Regulations

2. The Slaughter-houses (Licensing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1955(**2**) shall be amended as provided in regulations 3 and 4.

Animals which may be slaughtered in licensed meat plants

3. For regulation 8 there shall be substituted the following regulation—

"8. A person shall not use any slaughter-house or pig slaughter-house licensed under Section 1 of the Act, or cause any such premises to be used for the slaughter of an animal the meat derived from which is not intended for human consumption unless such slaughter takes place pursuant to, and in accordance with, a slaughter scheme introduced by or under Council Regulation (EEC) No. 805/68(3)."

Records and returns

4.—(1) For the fourth Schedule there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in Part 1 of the Schedule to these Regulations.

Private Plants

- This form should be completed immediately after slaughter ceases at the end of the week and handed to the Department's Veterinary Officer.

District Councils

- 3. Where inspection is provided by a District Council, the form should be returned directly to the Department of Agriculture, Food Policy Division, Dundonald House, Upper Newtownards Road, Belfast BT4 3SB, to arrive not later than the Tuesday following the week to which the return relates.
- This slaughter return should agree with and be accompanied by the meat inspection return showing condemnation of carcases and parts of carcases.

DANI Veterinary Officers

- 5. Plant Management have been asked to give completed slaughter returns to the DANI Veterinary Officer in the plant. On receipt of the return, you should ensure that the total of each species shown in the slaughter return agrees with the total number you have recorded as inspected on the Meat Inspection Condemnation returns completed for cattle, sheep and pigs each week.
- 6. Both forms should then be returned directly to the Department of Agriculture, Food Policy Division, Dundonald House, Upper Newtownards Road, Belfast BT4 3SB, to arrive not later than the Tuesday following the week to which the return relates.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Slaughter-houses (Licensing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1955 to enable slaughter-houses to be used for the slaughter of animals which are not destined for human consumption, but which are slaughtered pursuant to a slaughter scheme introduced by or under Council Regulation (EEC) 805/68, as amended.

The Regulations also amend and update the records which the holder of a licence under Section 1 of the Slaughter-houses Act (Northern Ireland) 1955 must retain and furnish to the Department.
