LICENSING

Licensing (Form of Licence) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1997

Made - - - - 21st January 1997 Coming into operation 20th February 1997

The Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 33 of the Licensing (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(1) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Licensing (Form of Licence) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1997 and shall come into operation on 20th February 1997.

Form of licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor

2. A licence, other than an occasional licence (being in such form as may be prescribed by magistrates' courts rules), shall be in the form set out in the Schedule.

Revocation

3. The Licensing (Form of Licence) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990(**2**) are hereby revoked.

Warning to the Licence Holder

- This licence does not authorise the sale of intoxicating liquor on Christmas Day, Easter Day or Good Friday, or during any part of the period from 1 in any morning to half past 11 in that morning, or to a person admitted to the premises after half past 12 in the morning, or, where the function is due to end before 1 in the morning, less than half an hour before the function is due to end.
- This licence permits the purchase of intoxicating liquor in the part or parts of the premises specified in the licence by persons lawfully attending the function so specified only during the hours specified in the licence and its consumption during those hours and the first 30 minutes after the conclusion of those hours.
- 3. The licence must at any time during the period of the function when intoxicating liquor is sold, made available for purchase or being consumed in the premises, forthwith be produced by the person who is in charge of the sale of intoxicating liquor there for examination by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary at his request.
- 4. If it is not so produced without reasonable excuse the holder of the licence and that person are each guilty of an offence and are liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations prescribe the form of licence (other than an occasional licence), which is issued by a court and authorises the retail sale of intoxicating liquor under the Licensing (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 which came into operation on 20th February 1997.

These regulations revoke and replace the Licensing (Form of Licence) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990.
