## ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Taxis (Coleraine, Portstewart and Portrush) Bye-Laws (Northern Ireland) 1999

Made - - - - 1st February 1999 Coming into operation 15th March 1999

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 65(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(1) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Bye-Laws:

#### Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These Bye-Laws may be cited as the Taxis (Coleraine, Portstewart and Portrush) Bye-Laws (Northern Ireland) 1999 and shall come into operation on 15th March 1999.
- (2) In these Bye-Laws "taxi" means a public service vehicle used in standing or plying for hire on a road and used to carry passengers for hire and being a vehicle seating not more than eight passengers in addition to the driver.

#### Location and number of taxis

- **2.** In the local government district of Coleraine—
  - (a) in the town of Coleraine no stand or starting place for taxis shall be used except that specified in column 2 of Part I of the Schedule in relation to the location specified opposite thereto in column 1, their number shall not exceed that specified in column 3 and the hours available for use shall be as stated in column 4;
  - (b) in the town of Portstewart no stand or starting place for taxis shall be used except that specified in column 2 of Part II of the Schedule in relation to the location specified opposite thereto in column 1, their number shall not exceed that specified in column 3 and the hours available for use shall be as stated in column 4; and
  - (c) in the town of Portrush no stand or starting place for taxis shall be used except that specified in column 2 of Part III of the Schedule in relation to the location specified opposite thereto in column 1, their number shall not exceed that specified in column 3 and the hours available for use shall be as stated in column 4.
