**The Local Government (General Grant) Order
(Northern Ireland) 2000**

Made 9th May 2000

Coming into operation 20th June 2000

*To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 7(3) of the
Schedule to the Northern Ireland Act 2000.*

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph 3(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Local Government &c. (Northern Ireland) Order 1972^(a) and now vested in it^(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Local Government (General Grant) Order (Northern Ireland) 2000 and shall come into operation on 20th June 2000.

General Grant

2. For the purpose of paragraph 3(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Local Government &c. (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 the districts specified for the year ending 31st March 2001 shall be districts listed below—
