Regulation 5(4)

Selection criteria for the screening decision

Characteristics of projects

- 1. The characteristics of projects, having regard in particular to—
 - (a) the size of the project;
 - (b) the cumulative effect of the project considered in conjunction with other projects;
 - (c) the use of natural resources;
 - (d) the production of waste;
 - (e) pollution and nuisances; and
 - (f) the risk of accidents, having regard in particular to substances or technologies used.

Location of project

- 2. The environmental sensitivity of geographical areas likely to be affected by projects, having regard in particular to—
 - (a) the existing land use;
 - (b) the relative abundance, quality and regenerative capacity of natural resources in the area; and
 - (c) the absorption capacity of the natural environment, paying particular attention to the following areas—
 - (i) wetlands;
 - (ii) coastal zones;
 - (iii) mountain and forest areas;
 - (iv) nature reserves and parks;
 - (v) areas classified or protected under other legislation; special protection areas designated by EEA States pursuant to Council Directive 79/409/EEC(1) and 92/43/EEC(2);
 - (vi) areas in which environmental quality standards laid down in Community legislation have already been exceeded;
 - (vii) densely populated areas; and
 - (viii) landscapes of historical, cultural or archaeological significance.

The potential impact

- 3. The potential significant effects of projects, in relation to criteria set out under 1 and 2 above, having regard in particular to—
 - (a) the extent of the impact (geographical area and size of the affected population);
 - (b) the impact on other EEA States;
 - (c) the magnitude and complexity of the impact;
 - (d) the probability of the impact; and

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(e) the duration, frequency and reversibility of the impact.
