**The Salaries (Assembly Ombudsman and Commissioner for  
Complaints) Order (Northern Ireland) 2008**

*Made* - - - - 25th September 2008

*Coming into operation* - 3rd November 2008

The Office of the First Minister and deputy First Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 5(1) and (2) of the Ombudsman (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(a) and Article 4(1) and (2) of the Commissioner for Complaints (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(b) and now vested in it (c) makes the following Order:

**Title and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Salaries (Assembly Ombudsman and Commissioner for Complaints) Order (Northern Ireland) 2008 and shall come into operation on 3rd November 2008.

**Revocation**

2. The Salaries (Assembly Ombudsman and Commissioner for Complaints) Order (Northern Ireland) 2008(d) is revoked.

**Increase in Salaries**

3. The annual salaries payable to the Assembly Ombudsman and the Commissioner for Complaints shall be increased from £123,200 to £126,400 from 1st April 2008.
