The Specified Animal Pathogens (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010

Made - - - - 29th January 2010
Coming into operation 22nd February 2010

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development(1), makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 2(3), 5(1), 19, 30(1) and 60(1) of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(2).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Specified Animal Pathogens (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010 and shall come into operation on 22nd February 2010.

Amendment

- **2.** The Specified Animal Pathogens Order (Northern Ireland) 2008(3) is amended as set out in this Order.
- **3.** In Part 1 of Schedule 1 (Specified animal pathogens) after 35 (Peste des petits ruminants virus) insert——
 - "35A. Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome virus genotype 2"
