**The Wild Birds (Special Protection) (No.2) (Northern Ireland)
Order 2010**

Made - - - - - *8th December 2010*

Coming into operation- - - - - - *9th December 2010*

This Order is made in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4(10) of the Wildlife (Northern Ireland) Order 1985 **(a)**;

In accordance with Articles 4(12) and 29(3) of the 1985 Order the Department of the Environment**(b)**—

- (a) has consulted the Council for Nature Conservation and the Countryside;
- (b) has consulted any district council or other person affected and taken into consideration any objections or representations duly received; and
- (c) has consulted such persons appearing to the Department to be representative of persons interested in the shooting of birds of the species proposed to be protected by the Order;

Accordingly the Department makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds (Special Protection) (No.2) (Northern Ireland) Order 2010, and shall come into operation on 9th December 2010.

2. The Department declares that the period starting at 00:01 a.m. on 9th December 2010 and ending at midnight on 23rd December 2010 is a period of special protection for those birds listed in the Schedule.

The period of special protection lasts for 14 days from 00:01 am on 9th December to midnight on 23rd December 2010.
