

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

The Orchard Drive, Portadown (Footway) (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011

S.R. 2011 No. 337

1. Introduction

- 1.1. This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Regional Development to accompany the Statutory Rule (details above) which is laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly.
- 1.2. The Statutory Rule is made under Article 68(1) and (5) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 and is subject to the negative resolution procedure.

2. Purpose

- 2.1. The purpose of the rule is to abandon an area of 53 square metres of superseded footway at Orchard Drive, Portadown running diagonally across the garden of No. 28 Mahon Road, Portadown in a south-westerly direction from Mahon Road to Orchard Drive. The rule also requires the retention of any equipment belonging to statutory undertakers in the area to be abandoned and preserves their right to maintain such equipment there.

3. Background

- 3.1. The abandonment has been requested by the owner of the bed and soil. It will remove the existing public rights of way over his land. The applicant has already walled the route of old footway within the curtilage of his property and constructed a new footway round the edge of the road.

4. Consultation

- 4.1. The PSNI has been consulted and has no objection. Craigavon Borough Council has been notified of the proposal and has no objection.
- 4.2. A notice in respect of the proposed abandonment was published in the local press for 2 successive weeks, a notice was posted on site and the statutory undertakers were notified of the proposal. No objections were received.

5. Equality Impact

- 5.1. Consideration has been given to compliance with section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998. No equality issues have been identified by the Department and no issues were raised following the publication of the notice in the press.

6. Regulatory Impact

- 6.1. A Regulatory Impact Assessment was not considered necessary as the proposal does not result in any costs or savings to business, charities or the voluntary bodies.
