Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 (Application of sections 82 and 83 to Coleraine Borough Council) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011

Made - - - - *13th January 2011*

Coming into operation - *4th February 2011*

This Order is made in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3(1) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907(a) (“the Act”) and now vested in the Department of the Environment(b) (“the Department”).

Coleraine Borough Council (“the Council”) has in pursuance of the provisions of section 3 of the Act applied to the Department for an Order declaring sections 82 and 83 of the Act to be in force in the district of the Council.

The Department is satisfied that the Council has complied with the provisions of section 3 of the Act as to advertising of a Notice of Intention to make such an application and at least one month has elapsed since the date of such advertisement.

The Department makes the following Order.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 (Application of sections 82 and 83 to Coleraine Borough Council) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011 and shall come into operation on 4th February 2011.

Application

2. Sections 82 and 83 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 are hereby declared to be in force in the district of Coleraine Borough Council.
