The Public Service Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015

Made - - - - 9th February 2015

Coming into operation - 6th April 2015

The Department of the Environment makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 61(1), 66(1) and 218(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Service Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and shall come into operation on 6th April 2015.

Amendment of the Public Service Vehicles Regulations

- **2.**—(1) The Public Service Vehicles Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1985(**b**) are amended in accordance with paragraphs (2) and (3).
 - (2) In regulation 7(c) (licence, disc and plates)—
 - (a) in paragraph (2) omit "in the case of a bus, issue a disc and,";
 - (b) omit paragraphs (3) and (4); and
 - (c) in paragraph (5) omit "disc referred to in paragraph (2) and the".
 - (3) Omit Schedule 9(d) (identifying symbols for bus and taxi discs).
