

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO
THE RIVER LAGAN FOOT/CYCLE BRIDGE ORDER (NORTHERN
IRELAND) 2016

S.R. 2016 No. 112

1. Introduction

- 1.1. This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Regional Development to accompany the Statutory Rule (details above) which is laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly.
- 1.2. The Statutory Rule is made under Article 4 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 and is subject to the negative resolution procedure.

2. Purpose

- 2.1. The draft River Lagan Foot/Cycle Bridge Order (Northern Ireland) 2016 is required to facilitate the Department's construction of the new bridge over the River Lagan.

3. Background

- 3.1. The Department held a number of information events in January 2015 and as a result of the comments received, changed the design to enable the bridge piers to provide at least 25 metres clearance between the piers and the east riverbank.

4. Consultation

- 4.1. Notice of the draft Order was published during week commencing 24 June 2015 and the statutory consultation period ended on 28 August 2015. There were no objections to the Orders..

5. Equality Impact

- 5.1. At this stage there are no known Section 75 implications. Following publication of the Notice of Intention in the local press, no Section 75 issues were raised.

6. Regulatory Impact

- 6.1. A Regulatory Impact Assessment was not considered necessary.

7. Financial Implications

- 7.1. The overall cost of the bridge is estimated to be in the region of £8m. However, no funding is available to take forward the scheme immediately. At their meeting on 16 February, Belfast City Council Planning Committee recommended planning approval for the bridge project. The Department therefore proposes to make the Bridge Orders now so that if resources become available at a later stage, the necessary Statutory Rules are in place to facilitate construction of the bridge.

- 8.1. The Department has carried out a Human Rights Act Screening Analysis and no human rights issues have been identified.
