

## COUNTY INFIRMARIES AND FEVER HOSPITAL. Accounts.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN  
IRELAND UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT (NORTHERN  
IRELAND), 1923, SECTION 1, SUB-SECTION 3.

To the Joint Committees of County Infirmaries and Fever Hospitals in Northern Ireland; and to all others whom it may concern:

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of all other powers enabling the Ministry in this behalf, hereby orders and directs as follows, that is to say:—

1. This Order may be cited as the County Infirmaries and Fever Hospital (Accounts) Order, 1924.

2. In this Order the expression "Joint Committee" means a Joint Committee of a County Infirmary or Fever Hospital in Northern Ireland appointed under section 15 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898.

3. The Union Accounts Order, 1905, and the appropriate forms contained in the said Order, shall so far as the same may be applicable apply with the necessary modifications to a Joint Committee subject to such alterations and omissions as may from time to time be approved of by the Ministry, either generally or in the case of any particular Joint Committee.
