

2. All Registrars shall be liable to transfer from one County Court to another, as the Minister of Home Affairs may direct.

3. The remuneration for each post of Registrar or for any person appointed to such post shall be fixed from time to time by the Minister of Home Affairs in conjunction with the Minister of Finance.

4. A Registrar shall discharge such duties as are by law or prescription attached to the office of a Registrar of Civil Bill Courts, and such other duties as may be assigned to him by the County Court Judge.

5. A Registrar—

(a) may at any time retire voluntarily and shall retire on attaining the age of 65; and

(b) may at any time be removed from office by the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister of Home Affairs on grounds of permanent incapacity by reason of bodily or mental infirmity, or on grounds of misconduct or incompetence.

6. The Regulations made on the Twentieth day of December, 1927, setting out the conditions of appointment and service of officers in the County Court Service shall not apply to part-time Registrars.

WHEREAS by the Dangerous Drugs Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, the Dangerous Drugs Acts (Northern Ireland), 1920 to 1925, were amended so far as was necessary to assimilate the law in

Northern Ireland to the law in force in Great Britain in relation to certain dangerous drugs and drugs capable of being converted into dangerous drugs, and it was enacted by Section 5 (3) of the said Act that the said Act should, as respects any particular provision thereof, come into operation as from such date as the Governor of Northern Ireland might by Order in Council appoint, having regard to the date appointed by His Majesty by Order in Council for the coming into operation of any provision of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932 (passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom):

And whereas His Majesty in pursuance of the powers conferred on him, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, was pleased by Order in Council on the 25th day of May, 1933, to appoint that the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932, should come into operation on the 9th day of July, 1933:

Now, therefore, We, the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in this behalf hereby appoint that all the provisions of the Dangerous Drugs Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, shall come into operation on the 28th day of July, 1933.

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935, DATED 28TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1935, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, C. 46) FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION, AND DISTRIBUTION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS TO WHICH PART III OF THAT ACT APPLIES.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by section seven of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby order and direct that the Regulations entitled "The Dangerous Drugs
