# Butter and Margarine (Sales).

REGULATIONS DATED THE TWENTY-SECOND DAY OF JUNE, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN TRELAND), 1934.

1938. No. 80.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:

Short Title and Commencement.

1.—These Regulations may be cited as the Butter and Margarine (Sales) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1938, and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1938.

Construction and Citation.

2.—These Regulations, the principal Regulations(a), and the Butter and Margarine (Sales) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934(b), shall be construed as one and may be cited as the Butter and Margarine (Sales) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1934 to 1938.

Forms.

3.—The forms set forth in the Schedule hereto, or forms to the like effect, shall be used in the cases to which they are applicable, and shall, for the purposes of sections five and six of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, and of these Regulations, be deemed to be the prescribed forms.

4.—For the purposes of sub-section (1) of section five of the Milk Rates of and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, the "full rate", Fees. for the calculation of the sum payable under sub-section (6) of section four of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, shall be four shillings and six pence per hundredweight, and the "reduced rate" for the calculation of the said sum shall be one penny per hundredweight.

5.—Article 7 of the principal Regulations shall have effect as if Records. the following paragraph were added thereto:

"(2) Where a licence holder sells butter for margarine to any persons for manufacturing purposes and has received from such persons certificates signed in accordance with sub-section (3) of section five of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, to the effect that the butter or margarine has been purchased for manufacturing purposes and that it will not be used for any other purpose, he shall keep a record in respect of each day showing:

(i) the names and addresses of persons to whom he sold butter or margarine for manufacturing purposes and from whom certificates, as aforesaid, were received in respect of such butter or margarine and the quantity so sold to each;

(ii) the names and addresses of such persons by whom butter or margarine sold to them for manufacturing purposes was returned to him and the quantity returned by each."

6.—Every licence holder shall furnish to the Ministry, not later Returns. than the Wednesday of each week, a return in the prescribed form of his sales of, and other dealings in, butter or margarine during the preceding week and shall, at the same time, transmit to the Ministry the sum (if any) payable under sub-section (6) of section four of the Act in respect of butter or margarine sold by him during the week to which the return relates:

Provided that the Ministry may, if it think fit, make such other arrangements with licence holders for the payment of licence fees. as may appear to the Ministry to be suitable, and in the event of any such arrangements being made with any licence holder the form of return made by him shall be modified accordingly.

7. Article 8 of the principal Regulations, the Second Schedule Revocations. thereto, and the Butter and Margarine (Sales) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1937(c), are hereby revoked.

## **Equalisation Payments.**

REGULATIONS, DATED 1STH DAY OF AUGUST, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SUB-SECTION (1) OF SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

1938. No. 109.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (1) of Section Nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

1.—(1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The Act" means the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1938;

"The Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland;

Other expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

- 2.—Equalisation payments in respect of milk produced in Northern Ireland and delivered to a processed milk factory and used for the manufacture of a prescribed milk product in any month shall be made by the Ministry as soon as may be after the average price paid in respect of milk produced in Northern Ireland and delivered to creameries and used for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter in that month shall have been ascertained.
- 3.—The equalisation payment in respect of milk delivered to a processed milk factory in any month shall, at the discretion of the Ministry, be made either (1) through the agency of the processed milk factory, which shall distribute, as soon as may be, the total amount of the payment amongst the persons who delivered such milk, or (2) direct to the latter persons. Where payment is made through the agency of the processed milk factory the amount to be paid to each such person shall be made on the basis of the butterfat yield of the milk delivered by him to the processed milk factory: provided that the Ministry may in special circumstances authorise the equalisation payment to be made on the basis of the number of gallons delivered by a supplier to a processed milk factory.
- 4.—An application for equalisation payment in respect of milk delivered to a processed milk factory in any month shall be made by such factory in the form or to the effect set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

Save as hereinafter provided, each such application shall be duly completed and forwarded so as to reach the office of the Ministry not later than the fourteenth day of the month following that to which the application relates.

Provided that applications for equalisation payments in respect of milk delivered to a processed milk factory in the months of April, May, June and July, 1938, shall be made to the Ministry not later than the 27th day of August, 1938.

- 5.—An annual Summary of Accounts duly audited by a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants or of the Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors, or of the Corporation of Accountants, Limited, or of the London Association of Certified Accountants, Limited, shall be furnished in the form or to the effect set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations as soon as may be after the close of the trading year, and in any case within three months of the period covered by the account.
- 6.—The equalisation payment in respect of milk delivered to a processed milk factory in any month may be withheld—

- (a) if the price per gallon paid for such milk by such processed milk factory is not, in the opinion of the Ministry, fair and reasonable, having regard to the costs of management and operation of the processed milk factory and to the market values of the prescribed milk products;
- (b) if the percentage of butter-fat in the total quantity of such milk used by such processed milk factory for the manufacture of the prescribed milk products is, in the opinion of the Ministry, abnormally low, having regard to the season of the year and other circumstances affecting the production of milk.
- 7.—(1) The owner or occupier of a processed milk factory shall furnish to the Ministry in respect of each month a return in the form or to the effect set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations, showing (i) the names and addresses of all licensed producers from whom milk of Grade A or Grade B or Grade C was received and used by the factory during such month for the purpose of manufacture of the prescribed milk products, and (ii) the quantity and grade thereof received in the case of each such producer.
- (2) Each such return shall be duly completed and forwarded so as to reach the office of the Ministry not later than the fourteenth day of the month following that to which the return relates.
- 8.—The owner or occupier of a processed milk factory shall permit any duly authorised officer to inspect the account books, vouchers, and other records kept by the factory and to take such extracts therefrom as he may deem necessary for the purpose of ensuring that these regulations are being complied with by such factory.

The owner or occupier of the processed milk factory shall afford such facilities and assistance at each such inspection as the said officer may require.

- **9.**—In the event of the owner or occupier of a processed milk factory failing to comply with these regulations the Ministry may withhold any equalisation payments which may otherwise be due in respect of milk delivered to such factory.
- 10.—These regulations may be cited as the Milk (Equalisation Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1938, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

REGULATIONS, DATED 26TH SEPTEMBER, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS ACT (NORTHERN TRELAND), 1934.

### 1938. No. 121.

The Ministry of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section Nine of the Milk and Milk Products Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

### 1. Short Title.

These Regulations shall be known as "The Milk (Equalisation Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1938, No. 2."

# 2. Equalisation Payments.

The equalisation payment to be made in respect of all milk produced in Northern Ireland and delivered to (i) creameries and used for the purpose of the extraction of cream for sale as such or for manufacture into butter; (ii) undertakings prescribed by the Ministry of Agriculture and engaged in the manufacture of
