The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section Seven of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1924, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Rules, that is to sav :--

1.—The Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(a), Amendment of the Marketing shall have effect as if :--

of Eggs Rules for the specifications for No. 3 Standard Case and No. 3 (Northern Standard Case (Large) set out in Part I of the Schedule there were substituted the specifications set out in the Schedule to these Rules.

2.—(1) These Rules may be cited as the Marketing of Eggs Citation, Construction (No. 3) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939. and Commencement.

- (2) These Rules shall be construed as one with the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938(b); the Marketing of Eggs (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938(c); the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(a); and the Marketing of Eggs (No. 2) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(d), and shall be included among the Rules which may be cited together as the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938 to 1939.
- (3) These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1939.

Each end shall consist of three boards fixed upright, one of which shall be placed exactly in the middle of the end, and shall be not less than 4½ inches wide. To the end boards shall be nailed cross battens measuring not less than 12½ inches by 2 inches by ½ inch thick, two on each end, fixed externally, one across the bottoms of the end boards and the other as close to the tops of the end boards as the construction of the lid permits. The ends of the battens shall be flush with the outer sides of the side boards.

#### Centre Division:

To be made of one or more boards and be not less than 131 inches deep and 115 inches wide. The division shall be fixed in the centre of the case secured by nails driven through the side and bottom boards.

#### Spacing:

The spacing between any two adjoining boards throughout the case shall nowhere exceed 4 inch, except between the centre division boards.

In constructing the tops and bottoms of cases two boards may be used instead of three provided that the spacing does not exceed  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch.

When spacing is provided between any two side boards; it shall be arranged so as to prevent any of the flats working through.

## Nails and Nailing:

Not less than two nails shall be used in each end of each board including the cross battens, and an additional nail shall be used at each end of a board, for every 3 inches or part of 3 inches by which the board exceeds 5 inches in width.

The nails for making up No. 3 Standard Case shall be not less than 1½ inches of 14 gauge, except for the construction of the ends when 1½ inches of 14 gauge shall be used.

Nails shall be cement-coated and shall be driven askew the grain of the wood.

# No. 3 STANDARD CASE (LARGE),

This case is designed for 3 hd. (360) hen eggs of the "Special" or "Extra Special" grades or duck eggs.

The construction of this case is the same as that of the foregoing case (No. 3 Standard) with the exception of the following details and, with the necessary modifications, shall be constructed in like manner to that case.

Selected	For hen eggs weighing not less than 11 ounces.

Ducks	For duck eggs of reasonably uniform size.

Constitution

3.—These Rules shall be construed as one with the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938(a), the Marketing of Eggs (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938(b), the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(c), the Marketing of Eggs (No. 2) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(d), and the Marketing of Eggs (No. 3) Rules (Northern Ireland), 1939(e), and these Rules and those Rules shall be cited together as the Marketing of Eggs Rules (Northern Ireland), 1938 to 1939.

## Retailers' Prices.

RULES, DATED THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION SEVEN OF THE MARKETING OF Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1924.

1939. No. 27.

The Ministry of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section seven of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1924, section seven of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1936, as amended by section one of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1937, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Rules, that is to say:—

1.—Subject to the provisions of these Rules, hen eggs purchased from producers by holders of retailers' licences, not being licensed wholesale dealers, shall be purchased at prices not less than the prices applying under section one of the Marketing of Eggs Act (Northern Ireland), 1936:

Provided that where eggs are delivered to the holder of a retailer's licence at premises in any market the price payable for such eggs shall be one halfpenny per lb. more than the price applying under the aforesaid section one.
