character. The name and address of the employer shall be notified to the pension authority."

The principal Regulations shall have effect as if :---

(a) after Regulation 15 thereof the following Regulation were inserted :---

"15A. References in these Regulations to children or to a child shall be construed as including step-children or a step-child and adopted children or an adopted child within the meaning of the Adoption of Children Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 the Adoption of Children Act, 1926, and the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930."

(b) the Schedule were omitted therefrom.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Pensions (Increase) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947, and these Regulations and the principal Regulations may be cited together as the Pensions (Increase) Regulations Northern Ireland), 1933 and 1947.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED THE 24TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1947, APPROVING RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE PHARMACEUTICAL SOCIETY OF NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE MEDICAL FACULTY OF THE QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY OF BELFAST, AMENDING THE THIRD SCHEDULE TO THE MEDICINES, PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of Section Twenty-six of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, it is provided that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland and the Medical Faculty of the Queen's University, Belfast, may from time to time, by a resolution passed by both of these bodies, declare that the Third Schedule to the said Act ought to be amended by including in, or removing from, any part thereof any substances specified in the resolution, or by transferring a substance so specified from one part of the said Schedule to another part;

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AND WHEREAS both the said Council and the said Medical Faculty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the said subsection (2) of Section Twenty-six of the said Act, did, on the 21st day of February, 1947, and on the 12th day of March, 1947, respectively, resolve and declare that the Third Schedule to the said Act ought to be amended as follows :—

I (i) (a). In Part I of the said Third Schedule after the substance "Dihydrocodeinone; its esters" under the heading relating to alkaloids there shall be inserted the substance "Dihydrodesexymorphine".

(b) After the substance "Para-amino-benzoic acid; esters of; their salts" there shall be inserted the substance "Pethidine; its salts".

(ii) At the end of Part II of the said Third Schedule there shall be added the substance "Zinc-phosphide";

AND WHEREAS the said Council and the said Medical Faculty, by virtue of and in further exercise of the power vested in them by the said sub-section (2) of Section Twenty-six of the said Act, did, on the 27th day of June, 1947, and on the 1st day of July, 1947, respectively, resolve and declare that the said Third Schedule to the said Act ought to be further amended as follows :—

II. After the substance "2 — thiouracil" there shall be inserted the substances "its alkyl derivatives";

AND WHEREAS the above resolutions have been submitted by the Minister of Home Affairs for the approval of the Governor in the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in accordance with the provisions of subsection (3) of the said Section Twenty-six of the said Act, and the Governor is of opinion that the said resolutions should be approved :

Now, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM SPENCER, EARL GRANVILLE, K.C.V.O., C.B., D.S.O., Vice-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the consent of the Privy Council, am hereby pleased to signify my approval of the said resolutions.
