Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. As from the specified date Order N.I.Bk. (89) as amended shall Statutory have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this minimum remuneration.
- 2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the Commence-24th day of November, 1949. Provided that where, as respects any ment. worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
- 3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Council Short title (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 5) Order, and interpretation, 1949.

When a customary holiday falls on a Saturday, the normal working day on each of the days Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in the week following such Saturday shall, in the case of a worker whose normal working week includes work on each of the week-days Monday to Saturday and whose normal hours of work on Saturday do not exceed five, be reduced by one half-hour."
