- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Training College Teachers' (Salaries and Allowances) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950.
  - 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.
- 3. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Training College Teachers' (Salaries and Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948, as amended by the Training College Teachers' (Salaries and Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948
- 4. Regulation 2 (d) of the existing Regulations shall be amended by the deletion of the words "and Larkfield Training College, Dunmurry, Belfast."
- 5. The proviso (2) to Regulation 8 of the existing Regulations shall be amended by the deletion of the date "1st April, 1948" and the substitution therefor of the date "1st April, 1955."

## EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING Payment of Travelling Expenses

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND DECEMBER, 1950, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

1950. No. 230

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (3) of section 5 of the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Employment and Training (Payment of Travelling Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950, and shall come into operation forthwith.
  - (2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
    "the Act" means the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950;
  - "the Ministry" means the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland.
- (3) Reference in these regulations to any enactment shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by or under any other enactment.

Citation, commencement and interpretation.

- (4) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
- 2. Where any payment by way of loan has been made by the Minis-Repayment try under the provisions of section 5 of the Act (which section provides out of Northern Ireland for payments towards cost of removal and resettlement of workers) to National or in respect of any person, being a person satisfying the contribution Insurance conditions for unemployment benefit under the National Insurance Fund in connection Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, on account of expenses of travelling to with loans any place for the purpose of obtaining employment, whether or not that person obtains employment at that place, the amount which the Ministery may repay out of the Northern Ireland National Insurance Fund shall be one half of the amount (if any) by which the said payment exceeds four shillings.
