The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section (1) of section fifty-one of the Elections and Franchise Act (Northern Ireland), 1946 (Reprint to 1948), and of every other power it thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral (Local Government Elections) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

(3) These Regulations shall come into force on the First day of May, 1952.

(4) The Electoral (Local Government Elections) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, are hereby revoked.

2. For Paragraph (C) of Regulation 31 of the Electoral (Local Government Elections) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949, there shall be substituted the following Paragraph —

“(C) The document of identity to be produced for the inspection of the Presiding Officer by a person applying for a ballot paper shall be any official document issued by a department of the Government of the United Kingdom or of the Government of Northern Ireland ; or by a local authority or public body in Northern Ireland ; or by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary in charge of a Station ; which bears a description or particulars of the holder sufficient to identify him with the entry in the Register in respect of which he is applying to vote.”
