

to another teacher for the same period) which would be payable if he were recognised permanently in the post in which he is employed.

(4) For the purpose of this Regulation a "working day" means a day (other than a Saturday or a Sunday) on which the school is in operation or on which, though the school is not in operation, the temporary teacher is, for a reason satisfactory to the Ministry, required to be in attendance or to hold himself available for duty at the school.

(5) In the case of any person to whom, in respect of any period of service, remuneration is paid on a daily basis in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation, each working day shall, for the purposes of the award of increment and for such other purposes as the Ministry may determine, be reckoned as 1/200th of a year of service:

Provided that in any 12 consecutive months any such period of service together with any other period of teaching service, which such person may perform during the said 12 consecutive months, shall not be reckoned as more than one year of service."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The purpose of these Regulations is to provide that all temporary teachers in primary schools and not only those who have been described as locum tenens or substitute teachers shall be paid at the daily rate of 1/200th of the annual salary which the teacher would have received if he had been in substantive employment.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of powers vested in it by Sections 35, 75, and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Registration and Attendance of Pupils (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1958.

(3) The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Registration and Attendance of Pupils Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948(a).

2. Regulation 12 of the existing Regulations is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The purpose of the Regulations is to facilitate the introduction of more effective arrangements for the notification, to the local education authority, of the names of pupils who fail to attend school regularly.

RULES, DATED 27TH AUGUST, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE TEACHERS (SUPERANNUATION) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950 TO 1956, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 25 of the Teachers (Superannuation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, as applied by the Ministries (Transfer of Functions) (Teachers Superannuation) Order, 1951(b), and by sub-section (1) of Section 7 of the Teachers (Superannuation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, as amended by paragraph (a) of sub-section (4) of Section 8 of the Teachers (Superannuation) (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland), 1956, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Teachers (Superannuation) Amending Rules (Northern Ireland), 1958, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1957.
