

- (b) only eggs produced on the owner's farm from 2nd year (or older) hens which formed the previous year's accredited pens are hatched;
- (c) all chicks are disposed of as day-olds and as hatched;
- (d) suitable facilities shall be available for ensuring cleanliness and the avoidance of the spread of disease, together with sufficient space to allow pure-bred and first cross chicks to be boxed, and the boxes placed ready for despatch; normally this will entail the provision of a separate incubator room, despatch room and a wash room fitted with a supply of hot and cold water;
- (e) two white or predominantly white breeds shall not be mated together, with the exception that White Leghorn males may be mated with Light Sussex females, and Light Sussex males may be mated with White Leghorn females;
- (f) a Light Sussex male shall not be used for crossing with hens of any breed other than White Leghorn."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Scheme which amends the Accredited Poultry Farms (Northern Ireland) Scheme, 1958, gives the Ministry power to permit on specified conditions the sale by accredited farms of day-old as hatched chicks for table purposes in the closed season.

### PHARMACY AND POISONS

#### The Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland

REGULATIONS DATED 19TH MARCH, 1959, MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE PHARMACEUTICAL SOCIETY OF NORTHERN IRELAND, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS, UNDER SECTION THREE OF THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section Three of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1925(a), hereby makes the following Regulations:

1. For Regulation 44 of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations, 1956(b), there shall be substituted the following Regulation:

"44.—(1) A candidate applying to be registered as a student of the Society shall furnish the Council with documentary evidence of having passed in the following subjects of one of the recognised examinations:

English Language, a Mathematical subject, Physics, Chemistry and any other subject, provided, however, that

(a) the five subjects must have been passed on one and the same occasion, or

(a) 15 & 16 Geo. V. c. 8 (N.I.).

(b) S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1956, No. 115.

(b) if the five subjects have not been taken at the one occasion then at least one of the subjects must have been passed at advanced (or higher) level, or credits must have been obtained in at least two of the subjects taken at ordinary (or lower) level.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation the following examinations are recognised by the Council:

The Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland.

The Leaving Certificate Examination of the Scottish Education Department.

The General Certificate of Education Examination of the following examining bodies:

University of Bristol.

University of Durham.

University of London.

Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate.

Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Board.

Oxford Local Examinations Delegacy.

The Associated Examining Board for the General Certificate of Education.

Joint Matriculation Board of the Northern Universities.

Southern Universities Joint Board for School Examinations.

Welsh Joint Education Committee.

2. These Regulations may be cited as The Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations, 1959, and shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1959.
