COUNTY COURTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1959

County Courts—Belfast Recorder's Court

ORDER, DATED 30TH NOVEMBER, 1960, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTIONS TWO AND FOUR OF THE COUNTY COURTS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1959(a).

I, the Right Honourable Brian Faulkner, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections two and four of the County Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1959, do hereby order as follows:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the County Courts Times of Sittings (Belfast Recorder's Court) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960:

Times of sittings

2. Sittings of the Belfast Recorder's Court shall be held in the months of January, February, March, April, May, June, September, October and November in each year.

Business to be transacted

3.—(1) The business to be transacted at the sittings held in the months of February, May and October shall be all such criminal and other business as may be properly cognizable and determinable by a county court.

(2) The business to be transacted at the sittings held in the months of June, September and November shall be all such business (other than criminal business but including appeals from petty sessions) as may be properly cognizable and determinable by a county court.

(3) The business to be transacted at the sittings held in the months of January, March and April shall be all such civil business (including appeals from petty sessions in cases of a civil nature) as may be properly cognizable and determinable by a county court.
