DANGEROUS DRUGS

REGULATIONS, DATED 11TH OCTOBER, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT 1965.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 11 of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. In paragraph one of the Second Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965(b) which specifies drugs and preparations to which Part II of those Regulations applies with certain modifications—

(a) the item “Dextropropoxyphene” shall be omitted; and

(b) after the item “Ethylmorphine (3. ethylmorphine)” there shall be inserted the item “Nicocodine”.

2. The Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

Under the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965 (Modification) Order 1965 S.I. 1965/1534 “Dextropropoxyphene” is freed from control under the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965 and these amending Regulations accordingly provide for deleting the reference to that drug in the Regulations having effect under that Act. In addition these Regulations make provision for inserting “Nicocodine”, hitherto subject to full control under the Regulations, into the Second Schedule, drugs which are subject to control modified in certain respects: in particular, they can be obtained from an authorised seller of poisons without a prescription.
