14. Hoists and hoistways the landing and cage entrances of which are protected by lattice gates.	Section 23(4) and (7), in so far as they relate to the protection to be provided by the gates.	The gates when shut shall extend to the full height and width of the entrance openings and, except in the case of gates installed before the coming into operation of this Order, shall have no openings exceeding two and a half inches in width. Measures shall be taken to prevent the access of feet through the cage gate or the landing gate into the hoistway, and to prevent the access of fingers through the landing gate to the interlocking mechanism and control devices in the cage or on the platform.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order exempts certain classes or descriptions of hoists and hoistways from some of the requirements of sections 23, 24 and 26 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965. It replaces the Factories (Exemption of Hoists) Order (Northern Ireland) 1939 and the Factories (Exemption of Hoists) Amendment Order (Northern Ireland) 1947.

ORDER, DATED 31ST MAY 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 83(2) OF THE OFFICE AND SHOP PREMISES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

I, the Right Honourable William James Morgan, Minister of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 83(2) of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), do hereby order as follows:—

(a) 1966. c. 26. (N.I.).

1. Except as provided by Article 2, the sections (which relate to first-aid) of the Act mentioned in the first column of the Schedule shall come into operation on the days specified opposite thereto in the second column of the Schedule.

2. Nothing in this Order shall apply in relation to premises which are in a covered market place, being a covered market place to which section 50 (power to adapt Act in relation to covered markets) of the Act relates.

3. This Order may be cited as the Office and Shop Premises (Appointed Days) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967.

This Order brings into operation, except in relation to premises in covered market places, the provisions of sections 24 to 26 (first-aid) and parts of section 77 (first-aid: application to the Crown) of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966.
