SCHEDULE 1 PREMISES WHERE A DESIGNATED DISEASE IS
 SUSPECTED OR CONFIRMED

Part I Premises on which a Designated Disease is
 Suspected

1. Record of Poultry
2. Isolation of poultry, captive birds, and racing pigeons
3. Prohibition on movement of poultry or other birds to or from premises
4. Prohibition on movement of persons, animals and vehicles to or from the premises
5. Prohibition on removal or spreading of things liable to transmit disease
6. Restriction on removal of eggs
7. Disinfection at entrances and exits

Part II Premises on which a Designated Disease is
 Confirmed

8. Slaughter and destruction
9. Destruction or treatment
10. Tracing
11. Disinfection and restocking
