The Food (Jelly Mini-Cups) (Emergency Control) (Scotland) Regulations 2004

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations—

“the Act” means the Food Safety Act 1990⁽¹⁾ and any expression used both in these Regulations and in the Act has the same meaning as in the Act;

“jelly mini-cups” means jelly confectionery of a firm consistence, contained in semi-rigid mini-cups or mini-capsules, intended to be ingested in a single bite by exerting pressure on the mini-cup or mini-capsule to project the confectionery into the mouth;

“prohibited additive” means any of the following food additives:—

- (i) E400 alginic acid;
- (ii) E401 sodium alginate;
- (iii) E402 potassium alginate;
- (iv) E403 ammonium alginate;
- (v) E404 calcium alginate;
- (vi) E405 propane 1, 2-diol alginate;
- (vii) E406 agar;
- (viii) E407 carrageenan;
- (ix) E407a processed eucheama seaweed;
- (x) E410 locust bean gum;
- (xi) E412 guar gum;
- (xii) E413 tragacanth;
- (xiii) E414 acacia gum;
- (xiv) E415 xanthan gum;
- (xv) E417 tara gum; or
- (xvi) E418 gellan gum.
