THE COURT, sentencing or otherwise dealing with the offender in respect of an offence to which section 51(4) of the Police, Public Order and Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2006 ("the

2006 Act") applies;
AND being satisfied that there are reasonable grounds to believe that making the football banning order would help to prevent violence or disorder at or in connection with any football

AND having explained to the offender the effect of this order (including the requirements set out below):

ORDERS that the offender shall report at the police station at [state address of police station] within 5 days beginning with the day on which this order is made;
