ROAD TRAFFIC

The A90 Trunk Road (Bogindollo, Angus) (Temporary Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order
2007

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, being satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order should be prohibited from making any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said length of road, and being satisfied that there is an alternative route suitable for traffic which will be affected by this Order, hereby make the following Order:

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A90 Trunk Road (Bogindollo, Angus) (Temporary Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2007, shall come into force on 26th May 2007 and shall cease to have effect at midnight on 30th June 2007.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of the said length of road by means of traffic signs as prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b).

Direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

That length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing - Fraserburgh Trunk Road being the northbound and southbound carriageways from a point 1.0 kilometre or thereby north of its junction with the B9128 Quilkoe Junction northwards to a point 100 metres or thereby south of its junction with the unclassified Milton of Finavon Road, a distance of 4.0 kilometres or thereby.

PART 2

1. Right turns to the unclassified Battledykes access road from the southbound carriageway.
2. Right turns from the unclassified Battledykes access road to the southbound carriageway.
3. Right turns to the unclassified Bogindollo road from the southbound carriageway.
4. Right turns from the unclassified Bogindollo road to the southbound carriageway.
5. Left turns to the unclassified Bogindollo road from the northbound carriageway.
6. Left turns from the unclassified Bogindollo road from the northbound carriageway.
7. Right turns to the unclassified Parkford Cottages access road from the northbound carriageway.
8. Right turns from the unclassified Parkford Cottages access road to the northbound carriageway.
9. Right turns to the unclassified Clatterha' Cottages access road from the southbound carriageway.
10. Right turns from the unclassified Clatterha' Cottages access road to the southbound carriageway.
