ROAD TRAFFIC

The M876 Special Road (Upper Forth Crossing at Kincardine) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2007

<i>Coming into force</i>	5 June 2007

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1) and (4) as read with section 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, being satisfied that the traffic on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order should be restricted or prohibited as hereinafter provided because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said lengths of road and having had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order, hereby make the following Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the M876 Special Road (Upper Forth Crossing at Kincardine) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2007, shall come into force on 5 June 2007 and shall cease to have effect at midnight on 4 December 2008.

Temporary prohibition on use of a road

2. Subject to Article 5, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to a part or parts of the lengths of road by means of traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b).

Temporary prohibition on overtaking

3. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other moving vehicle on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to a part or parts of the lengths of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 632 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

(2) Nothing in paragraph (1) of this Article shall prohibit any person from using, or permitting the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes a cycle, motor cycle, tricycle or any other vehicle not being a motor vehicle in accordance with section 140 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^(a).

Temporary speed restriction

4. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order at a speed exceeding that displayed on a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 when a restriction is identified as applying to a part or parts of the lengths of road by means of that sign.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes or a vehicle while being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

That length of the M876 Special Road from a point 1900 metres or thereby west of Bowtrees Roundabout in a generally easterly direction to Bowtrees Roundabout, a distance of 1900 metres or thereby.

That length of the M876 Special Road from Bowtrees Roundabout in a generally westerly direction to a point 1000 metres or thereby west of Bowtrees Roundabout, a distance of 1000 metres or thereby.
