ROAD TRAFFIC

The South East Unit Trunk Roads Area (Temporary Prohibitions of Traffic, Temporary Prohibitions of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restrictions) (No. 5) Order 2007

Made

30th May 2007

Coming into force

1st June 2007

The Scottish Ministers make the following order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(1) and (4) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted or prohibited as hereinafter provided because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said lengths of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the South East Unit Trunk Roads Area (Temporary Prohibitions of Traffic, Temporary Prohibitions of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restrictions) (No. 5) Order 2007, shall come into force on 1st June 2007 and shall cease to have effect at midnight on 31st August 2007.

2. In this Order a reference to a numbered column is to the column in the Schedule bearing that number.

Temporary prohibition on use of a road

3. Subject to Article 6, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on each length of road specified in column 1 of Part 1 of the Schedule during the period corresponding to that length of road specified in column 2 when a prohibition is identified as applying to a part or parts of that length of road by means of traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b).

Temporary prohibition on overtaking

4. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other moving vehicle on each length of road specified in column 1 during the period corresponding to that length of road specified in column 2 when a prohibition is identified as applying to a part or parts of that length of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 632 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002**(b)**.

(2) Nothing in paragraph (1) of this Article shall prohibit any person from using, or permitting the use of, any vehicle in such a way that it overtakes a cycle, motor cycle, tricycle or any other vehicle not being a motor vehicle in accordance with section 140 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**(a)**.

Temporary speed restriction

5. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, no person shall drive any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in column 1 of Parts 2 and 3 of the Schedule to this Order during the period corresponding to that length of road specified in column 2 at a speed exceeding that specified in column 3 when a restriction is identified as applying to a part or parts of that length of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

(2) When convoy working is in operation and indicated by one or more of the signs shown in Diagrams 7025, 7026, 7027, 7028 and 7029 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002, no person shall drive any vehicle on the length of road specified in column 1 of Part 3 of the Schedule at a speed exceeding 10 mph when a restriction is identified as applying to a part or parts of that length of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

6. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes or a vehicle while being used for carrying out the works.

From 1 st June 2007 to 31 st July 2007.

That length of the A68 Edinburgh – Newcastle upon Tyne Trunk Road being from the existing 40 mph speed limit signs at the south end of St Boswells to its junction with the unclassified Longnewton Junction, a distance of 10.9 kilometres or thereby.	From 1 st June 2007 to 31 st August 2007.	40 mph
