#### **ROAD TRAFFIC**

The A985 Trunk Road (Limekilns) (50mph Speed Limit) Order 2007

Made 5<sup>th</sup> October 2007 Coming into force 19<sup>th</sup> October 2007

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and having complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b), hereby make the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A985 Trunk Road (Limekilns) (50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2007 and shall come into force on 19<sup>th</sup> October 2007.

# **Restriction of speed**

2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 mph on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
