**The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees)
(Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 2007**

Made - - - - 6th November 2007
Laid before the Scottish
Parliament - - - - 7th November 2007
Coming into force in accordance with regulation 1(1)
and (2)

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972⁽¹⁾ and section 56(1) and (2) of the Finance Act 1973⁽²⁾.

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 2007 and come into force on 1st December 2007.

(2) Regulation 5 comes into force on 1st January 2008.

Amendment of the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005

2. The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005⁽³⁾ are amended in accordance with regulations 3 to 5.

Amendment of regulation 2

3. In regulation 2 (interpretation), after the definition of “normal working hours” insert ““official body of point of entry” has the same meaning as in article 2(1)(k) of the Directive;”.

The reference to a Government department in section 56(1) is to be read as a reference to the Scottish Administration by virtue of article 2(2) of the Scotland Act (Consequential Modifications) (No. 2) Order 1999 (S.I. 1999/1820) and the functions of the Minister transferred to the Scottish Ministers by virtue of section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998. The requirement to obtain the consent of the Treasury was removed by section 55 of the Scotland Act 1998.

Amendment of regulation 3

4. For regulation 3 (consignments to which regulations apply) substitute—

“3. These Regulations apply in relation to consignments of—

(a) plants, plant products and other objects of a description specified in the first column of Schedule 1 that are listed in Annex V, Part B of the Directive; or

(b) seeds of Solanaceae whether or not listed in Annex V, Part B of the Directive

and which are landed in Scotland from a third country in respect of which article 13d(1) of the Directive requires Member States to collect phytosanitary fees to cover the costs occasioned by documentary checks, identity checks and plant health checks or are the subject of an agreement made under article 12(6) of the Plant Health (Scotland) Order 2005(4).”.

Amendment of Schedule 2

5. For Schedule 2 (reduced import inspection fees for plant health checks) substitute—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 (“the principal Regulations”). The principal Regulations implement Article 13d of Council Directive 2000/29/EC (O.J. No. L 169, 10.7.00,p.1) which requires Member States to charge fees to cover the costs occasioned by the documentary checks, identity checks and plant health checks of certain imports of plants, plant products and other items from third countries.

These Regulations—

- (a) extend the application of the principal Regulations to consignments consisting of goods in transit within the European Community in respect of which the Scottish Ministers have agreed with the official body of point of entry for those goods, in accordance with the Plant Health (Scotland) Order 2005, to be responsible for certain matters; and
- (b) substitute a new Schedule 2 to the principal Regulations, to give effect to the latest agreed reduced rates for inspections of certain material (Schedule 2 to the principal Regulations includes provision for reduced rates for certain plants and plant products agreed under the procedure provided for in Articles 13d(2) and 18(2) of the Directive).

The changes to the fees made by these Regulations, which are set at a proportion of the standard fee (described in Schedule 1 to the principal Regulations) corresponding to the rate of inspection, are based on the agreed inspection rates set out in the table below.

- (2) Consignments subject to an inspection rate of 100% are excluded from the reduced rate inspection scheme and are subject to the import inspection fees specified in Schedule 1 to the principal Regulations.
