ROAD TRAFFIC

The A92/A972 Trunk Road (Kingsway East, Dundee)
(Temporary Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2008

Coming into force

9th May 2008
19th May 2008

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order should be prohibited from making any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they are satisfied that there is an alternative route suitable for traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A92/A972 Trunk Road (Kingsway East, Dundee) (Temporary Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2008, comes into force on 19th May 2008 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 29th September 2008.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of the said length of road by means of traffic signs as prescribed by Diagrams 612 or 613 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b).

Direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

That length of the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road from its junction with the M90/A90 Inverkeithing – Fraserburgh Trunk Road at Forfar Road, Dundee to its junction with Pitkerro Road Roundabout, Dundee a distance of 650 metres or thereby.

PART 2

1. All U turns from A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road eastbound to the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound at its junction with the A929 Forfar Road Junction;
2. All U turns from A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound to the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road eastbound at its junction with the A929 Forfar Road Junction;
3. All right turns from A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road eastbound to the A929 Forfar Road;
4. All left turns from A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound to the A929 Forfar Road;
5. All right turns from A929 Forfar Road to the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road eastbound carriageway;
6. All left turns from A929 Forfar Road to the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound carriageway;
7. All left turns from A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound to Martin Street; and
8. All left turns from Martin Street to the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road westbound carriageway.
