ROADS AND BRIDGES

The A76 Trunk Road (Horse Ploughing Match, Mauchline)
(Temporary Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 2009

Made 18th March 2009

Coming into force 29th March 2009

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 62(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 62(1) of that Act, they are of the opinion that considerations of public safety require that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be prohibited from waiting or loading.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A76 Trunk Road (Horse Ploughing Match, Mauchline)(Temporary Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 2009, comes into force on 29th March 2009 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 29th March 2009.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order, when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of the said length of road by means of the traffic sign prescribed in Diagram 636 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b) or as authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(c).

Permission or direction of Police Constable

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Exemption for emergency

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes.

SCHEDULE

1. That length of the A76 Dumfries – Kilmarnock Trunk Road from a point 400 metres or thereby north of its junction with Beechwood Road to a point 75 metres or thereby south of its junction with Beechwood Road a distance of 475 metres or thereby.
