The A77 Trunk Road (Haggstone Climbing Lane and Glen App Carriageway Improvement) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Revocation Order 2009

The Scottish Ministers make the following order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(1)(a) and (4), and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 15(2) of that Act, they are satisfied that the execution of the works under the A77 Trunk Road (Haggstone Climbing Lane and Glen App Carriageway Improvement) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2007(b) have been completed.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A77 Trunk Road (Haggstone Climbing Lane and Glen App Carriageway Improvement) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Revocation Order 2009 and comes into force on 1st April 2009.

Revocation of previous order

2. The A77 Trunk Road (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic, Temporary Prohibition of Overtaking and Temporary Speed Restriction) Order 2007 is hereby revoked.
