ROAD TRAFFIC

The M90/A90 Trunk Road (Gairneybridge to Milnathort)
(Temporary 50mph Speed Limit) Order 2009

Made 23rd June 2009

Coming into force 6th July 2009

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(1)(b) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(b) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule should be restricted as hereinafter provided because of the likelihood of danger to the public.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the M90/A90 Trunk Road (Gairneybridge to Milnathort) (Temporary 50mph Speed Limit) Order 2009, comes into force on 6th July 2009 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 16th July 2009.

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46.).

Temporary speed restriction

2. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on those lengths of roads specified in the schedule at a speed exceeding 50mph when a restriction is identified as applying to a part or parts of those lengths of road by means of a traffic sign prescribed in diagram 670 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 **(a)**.

THE M90/A90 TRUNK ROAD (GAIRNEYBRIDGE TO MILNATHORT) (TEMPORARY 50MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2009

The Scottish Ministers give notice that they have made the above Order temporarily restricting the speed of vehicles to 50mph on that length of the M90/A90 Inverkeithing – Fraserburgh Trunk Road from a point 2.5 kilometres or thereby south of junction 5, Gairneybridge, northwards to a point 2.5 kilometres or thereby north of junction 7, Milnathort, a distance of 12.66 kilometres or thereby.

The Order, which is required because of the likelihood of danger to the public during the T in the Park Festival event at Balado, Kinross, will be in operation from 6th July 2009 to midnight on 16th July 2009. The speed limit has been requested by the Police because of the likelihood of danger to the public caused by the volume of vehicular traffic going to and coming from the event.
