The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(a).

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Contracts and Utilities Contracts (Scotland) Amendment (Amendment) Regulations 2009.

(2) These Regulations come into force on 19th December 2009.

Amendment of the Public Contracts and Utilities Contracts (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2009

2.—(1) The Public Contracts and Utilities Contracts (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2009(b) are amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 2 (amendment of the Public Contracts Regulations)—

(a) in paragraph (4)(b)(i), for “second” substitute “first”; and

(b) in paragraph (5)(b)(i), for “second” substitute “first”.
