ROAD TRAFFIC

The A82 Trunk Road (Stuckindroin Bridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made 28th January 2010

Coming into force 8th February 2010

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 14(1) and (4), 2(1), (2) and (3) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order should be prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the said length of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Stuckindroin Bridge) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010, comes into force on 8th February 2010 and ceases to have effect at midnight on 12th March 2010.

Prohibition of use of vehicles and pedestrians

2. Subject to article 3, no person shall use the length of road specified in the Schedule and no person shall use or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule when a prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of that length of road by means of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

3. This Order shall not apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes, a vehicle while being used for carrying out the works or a person carrying out a duty in relation to the works.

Article 2

That length of the A82 Dalnottar to Inverness Trunk Road from a point 5.335 kilometres or thereby north of the unclassified access road to Sloy Power Station, Inveruglas to its junction with the unclassified access road to Pier Cottage, Ardlui, a distance of 1.135 kilometres or thereby.
