**The Refuges for Children (Scotland) Amendment
Regulations 2010**

Made - - - - - *19th February 2010*

Laid before the Scottish Parliament *22nd February 2010*

Coming into force - - - *16th March 2010*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 38(2) of the Children (Scotland) Act 1995(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Refuges for Children (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2010 and come into force on 16th March 2010.

Amendment of the Refuges for Children (Scotland) Regulations 1996

2.—(1) The Refuges for Children (Scotland) Regulations 1996(b) are amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 3 (designation of refuges: local authority establishments and foster households) for paragraph (b) substitute—

“(b) the household of a person who is approved as a foster carer under the Looked After Children (Scotland) Regulations 2009(c),”.

(3) In regulation 10(2) (withdrawal of designation of approval) for paragraph (c) substitute—

“(c) where a person approved as a foster carer under the Looked After Children (Scotland) Regulations 2009 has had that approval terminated under those Regulations;”.
