**The Loch Carron Urgent Marine Conservation (No.
2) Order 2017 (Urgent Continuation) Order 2018**

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 88(6) of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010⁽¹⁾ and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 88(7) of that Act, the Scottish Ministers intend to make a marine conservation order (a “permanent order”) in respect of the Loch Carron MPA⁽²⁾ (in accordance with the requirements of section 87 of that Act), and they have published notice of their proposal to make the permanent order⁽³⁾.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Loch Carron Urgent Marine Conservation (No. 2) Order 2017 (Urgent Continuation) Order 2018 and comes into force on 19th May 2018.

Continuation of the Loch Carron Urgent Marine Conservation (No. 2) Order 2017 and duration in force

2. The Loch Carron Urgent Marine Conservation (No. 2) Order 2017⁽⁴⁾ is to remain in force for the period of 364 days beyond that specified in article 1(2) of that Order.
