# 2 Number of chancellorships to be held by one person may be limited.

After section 2 of the MI Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Measure 1963 there shall be inserted the following section:—

### "2A Number of chancellorships to be held by one person may be limited.

- (1) Regulations made by the House of Bishops of the General Synod may makeprovision with respect to the maximum number of chancellorships ofdioceses which any one person may hold.
- (2) Nothing in any regulation made under this section shall be taken asprohibiting any person who at the date on which the regulation comesinto force holds more than the maximum number of chancellorshipsprescribed by the regulation from continuing to hold such offices.
- (3) Regulations made under this section shall be laid before the GeneralSynod and shall not come into operation until they have been approvedby the General Synod.
- (4) The Statutory Instruments Act 1946 shall apply to anyregulation approved under subsection (3) of this section as if theywere a statutory instrument and were made when so approved, and as ifthis Measure were an Act providing that any such regulations should besubject to annulment in pursuance of a resolution of either House of Parliament."
