

**CHAPTER ccxi.**

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Board of Education under the Elementary Education Acts 1870 to 1900 to enable the School Board for London to put in force the Lands Clauses Acts. A.D. 1902.

[8th August 1902.]

WHEREAS the Board of Education have made a Provisional Order under the authority of the Elementary Education Acts 1870 to 1900 on behalf of the School Board for London and it is requisite that the same should be confirmed by Parliament :

And whereas by the Board of Education Act 1899 it is provided that the Board of Education shall take the place of the Education Department and all enactments and documents shall be construed accordingly :

And whereas the lands required to be purchased under the powers granted by the said Provisional Order and confirmed by this Act are severally described in the schedule to the said Provisional Order as set out in the schedule to this Act and are delineated on the plans accompanying the petition referred to in the said Provisional Order and copies of all the said plans have been duly deposited in the Offices of the two Houses of Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The following Order as set out in the schedule to this Act shall be and is hereby confirmed and from and after the passing of this Act shall have full validity and force. Confirmation

2. Nothing contained in this Act or in the Order hereby confirmed shall extend to authorise the School Board for London to take use enter upon or interfere with any land soil or water or any Saving

Duchy of
Cornwall.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorise the said School Board to extinguish any public rights of way without such Order being obtained as but for this Act would have been required for that purpose.

4.—(1) The School Board shall not under the powers of this Act or of the said Order purchase or acquire in any metropolitan borough or in the City of London twenty or more houses or sites of houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were or have been since that day or shall hereafter be occupied either wholly or partly by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers unless and until—

(a) They shall have obtained the approval of the Secretary of State for the Home Department to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last or for such number of persons as the Secretary of State shall after inquiry deem necessary having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses or to the place of employment of such persons and to all the circumstances of the case; and

(b) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State for the carrying out of the scheme.

(2) The approval of the Secretary of State to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally and

after the Secretary of State has approved of any such scheme he may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme. A.D. 1902. ---

(3) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced. Provided that the Secretary of State may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement subject to such conditions (if any) as he may see fit.

(4) Any provisions of any scheme under this section or any conditions subject to which the Secretary of State may have approved of any scheme or of any modifications of any scheme or subject to which he may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement shall be enforceable by a writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Secretary of State out of the High Court.

(5) If the School Board acquire or appropriate any house or site for the purposes of this Act in contravention of the foregoing provisions or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house or site which penalty shall be recoverable by the Secretary of State by action in the High Court and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom. Provided that the Court may if it think fit reduce such penalty.

(6) For the purpose of carrying out any scheme under this section the School Board may subject to the approval of the Board of Education appropriate any lands for the time being belonging to them or which they have power to acquire and are authorised to appropriate for such purpose.

(7) The School Board may subject to such approval as aforesaid on any lands belonging to them or purchased or acquired under this section erect such dwellings for persons of the labouring class as may be necessary for the purpose of any scheme under this section and may sell demise or let or otherwise dispose of such dwellings and any lands purchased or acquired as aforesaid and may apply for the purposes of this section to which capital is properly applicable or any of such purposes any moneys which they may be authorised to raise or apply for the general purposes of their undertaking :

Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the School Board in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall for a period of twenty-five years from the date of such scheme be appropriated for the purpose of such dwellings and every conveyance demise or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment. Provided also that the Secretary of State may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection subject to such conditions (if any) as he may see fit.

(8) All buildings erected or provided by the School Board in the Administrative County of London for the purpose of any scheme under this section shall be subject to the provisions of the London Building Act 1894 (Local) and any other Act or Acts relating to buildings in that county.

(9) The Secretary of State may direct any inquiries to be held by any persons appointed by him as inspectors which he may deem necessary in relation to any scheme under this section or to the carrying out thereof and may appoint or employ inspectors for the purposes of any such inquiry and the inspectors so appointed or employed shall for the purposes of any such inquiry have all such powers as inspectors of the Local Government Board have for the purposes of inquiries directed by the Local Government Board under the Public Health Act 1875.

(10) The School Board shall pay to the Secretary of State any expenses incurred by him in relation to any inquiries under this section including the expenses of any witnesses summoned by the inspector and a reasonable sum to be fixed by the Secretary of State for the services of such inspector.

(11) Any houses purchased or acquired by the School Board for or in connexion with any of the purposes of this Act whether purchased or acquired in exercise of the powers conferred by this Act or otherwise and whether before or after the passing of this Act which may have been occupied by persons of the labouring class within five years before the passing of this Act and for which houses no substitutes have been or are directed to be provided by any scheme approved by the Secretary of State under any previous Act relating to the School Board shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to have been acquired under the powers of this Act and to have been occupied on the fifteenth day of December last by the same number of persons belonging to the labouring class as were

occupying the said houses at the date of their acquisition Provided A.D. 1902.
that if the Secretary of State is unable to ascertain the number of
such persons who were then occupying the said houses the said
houses shall be deemed to have been occupied by such number of
such persons as in the opinion of the Secretary of State they might
have been sufficient to accommodate.

(12) For the purposes of this section the expression "house" means any house or part of a house occupied as a separate dwelling and the expression "labouring class" means mechanics artizans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

(13) The School Board and the Board of Education and the Secretary of State are hereby respectively authorised and empowered to do all acts matters and things for carrying into full effect every such scheme as aforesaid and the School Board and the Board of Education shall for that purpose have the same powers as they have under the Elementary Education Acts 1870 to 1900 for the purpose of providing sufficient school accommodation for their district including the power of borrowing money under section ten of the Elementary Education Act 1873 and the carrying of such scheme into effect shall be deemed to be a work for which the School Board is authorised to borrow within the meaning of the Public Works Loans Act 1875.

5. Nothing contained in this Act or the Order set out in the schedule to this Act or on the plans therein mentioned shall be deemed to exempt any of the lands referred to in the said Order or the School Board in respect thereof from any of the provisions of the Metropolis Management Act 1855 the London Building Act 1894 and any Acts amending or extending the same.

6. Whereas certain of the sites which the School Board are by this Act and the Order scheduled hereto authorised to acquire abut upon streets or roads which are not in the opinion of the London County Council (in this section referred to as "the Council") sufficiently wide for the accommodation of the present and probable future traffic and for the convenience of the persons using the said streets or roads Now therefore the following provisions shall unless

A.D. 1902. — otherwise agreed between the Council and the School Board have effect (that is to say) :—

(1) At any time within six months after the School Board shall have acquired the sites or either of the sites abutting on Garratt Lane and described respectively in the schedule hereto under the headings plan Nos. 7 and 12 and delineated respectively on the plans numbered 7 and 12 respectively and signed for the purpose of identification by Arthur Frederick Jeffreys the Chairman of the Committee of the House of Commons to which the Bill for the Act confirming the Order was referred and thereon edged round with a blue line the School Board shall if required by the Council convey or otherwise effectually assure to the Council for the purpose of street widenings so much of the said sites or either of them as lies between the present line of the said streets or roads and the lines marked red on the said plans respectively and as the Council shall require the Council paying to the School Board as consideration therefor a proportionate part of the cost to the School Board of acquiring the whole of the property whereof the part to be so conveyed or assured as aforesaid shall in each case form part Provided that the Board shall not be called upon to pay and the Council shall undertake to indemnify the Board from the payment of any larger sum for expenses in respect of the making up of roads and footpaths fronting the lands shown on the said plans numbered 7 and 12 respectively than they would have been liable to pay if the lands to be conveyed as aforesaid had not so been purchased by the Council :

(2) With reference to the site abutting on Bolingbroke Grove and described in the schedule hereto under the heading plan No. 11 and delineated on the plan numbered 11 and signed as aforesaid by the said Arthur Frederick Jeffreys the School Board shall if required by the Council convey or otherwise effectually assure to the Council for the purpose of street widenings so much of the said site as lies between the present line of Bolingbroke Grove aforesaid and the line marked red on the said plan numbered 11 and as the Council shall require the Council paying to the School Board as consideration therefor such a sum as shall in default of agreement be determined by arbitration :

- (3) If at any time the School Board shall acquire the site abutting on Rosoman Street and described in the schedule hereto under the heading plan No. 23 and delineated on the plan numbered 23 and signed as aforesaid by the said Arthur Frederick Jeffreys and thereon edged round with a blue line and shall contemplate the demolition of the buildings now thereon the School Board shall give notice to the Council of such proposed demolition and within three months of the date of such notice the Board shall if required by the Council convey or otherwise effectually assure to the Council for the purpose of street widenings so much of the said property abutting on Rosoman Street aforesaid as lies between the present line of Rosoman Street aforesaid and the line marked red on the said plan numbered 23 and as the Council shall require the Council paying to the School Board as consideration therefor a proportionate part of the cost to the School Board of acquiring the whole of the property and of the cost of alterations and adaptations of the premises comprised in the site delineated on the plan numbered 23 as aforesaid : A.D. 1902.
- (4) At any time within six months after the School Board shall have acquired the site abutting on South Row and described in the schedule hereto under the heading plan No. 22 and delineated on the plan numbered 22 and signed as aforesaid by the said Arthur Frederick Jeffreys and thereon respectively edged round with a blue line the School Board shall if required by the Council convey or otherwise effectually assure to the Council so much thereof as lies between the present line of frontage and the line marked red on the said plan and the Council shall pay to the School Board as consideration for the acquisition from the School Board of so much of the said site as lies between the said line marked blue on the said plan and the line marked red on the said plan a proportionate part of the cost to the School Board of acquiring the whole of the said property but the School Board shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of so much of the said site as may be required to be surrendered by the Board under the statutory powers of the Council :
- (5) If at any time the School Board shall acquire the site abutting on Catherine Grove and described in the schedule hereto under the heading plan No. 28 and delineated on the plan numbered 28 and signed as aforesaid by the said Arthur

Frederick Jeffreys and thereon respectively edged round with a blue line and shall demolish the buildings now thereon abutting on Catherine Grove the School Board shall immediately upon such demolition if required by the Council convey or otherwise effectually assure to the Council for the purpose of widening Catherine Grove aforesaid so much of the said site as lies between the present line of the said street or road and the line marked red on the said plan and as the Council shall require the Council paying to the School Board as consideration therefor a proportionate part of the cost to the School Board of acquiring the whole of the said property :

- (6) The School Board shall give to the Council notice in writing of the acquisition of each of the said sites respectively described in the schedule hereto under the headings plans Nos. 7 12 and 22 forthwith after they have acquired the same respectively and of the demolition of the buildings on the said site described in the schedule hereto under the heading plan No. 28 forthwith after they have demolished the said buildings.

7. This Act may be cited as the Education Board Provisional Order Confirmation (London) Act 1902.

And whereas the lands so required to be purchased are set forth in the schedule hereunder written :

And whereas the said School Board have made due publication of the notices and have duly served the same according to the requirements of the Elementary Education Acts 1870-1900 and have presented a petition to the Board of Education praying that an Order may be made authorising the said School Board to put in force the powers of the said Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement in which petition were stated all the matters required by the said Elementary Education Acts to be stated therein and the same hath been supported by such evidence as the said Board of Education required :

And whereas the Board of Education having considered the said petition and the proofs of the publication and service of the proper notices have thought fit to proceed with the case and have caused inquiry to be made in the district of the said School Board wherein the said lands are situate as to the propriety of the proposed Order :

Now therefore the said Board of Education having received reports after such inquiry and having duly considered the same do hereby declare that it is proper and do hereby order accordingly that the said School Board be authorised to put in force with reference to the pieces of land set forth in the schedule hereunder written the powers of the said Acts for the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.
