And whereas a Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament:

And whereas it is expedient that the several Provisional Orders made by the Board of Trade under the authority of the said Acts as set out in the schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:--

- I. This Act may be cited as the Electric Lighting Orders Short title. Confirmation (No. 2) Act 1906.
- 2. The several Orders as amended and set out in the schedule Orders in to this Act shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all schedule the provisions thereof in manner and form as they are set out in the said schedule shall from and after the passing of this Act have full validity and effect.

- 3.—(1) Nothing in the Wembley Electric Lighting Order 1906 confirmed by this Act shall in any way limit or affect the powers of the Middlesex County Council to rebuild alter widen or repair the structure of any bridge upon which any work by the Order authorised shall be constructed or impose upon the county council any liability which was not by law imposed upon them prior to the commencement of the Order.
- (2) If at any time the county council require to carry out works for rebuilding altering widening or repairing any bridge which might involve interference with any portion of the undertaking by the Order authorised they shall prior to the commencement of such work give the Undertakers one month's notice of their intention to carry out such works and if in order to avoid interruption to the supply by the Undertakers of electrical energy it is in the opinion of the county council necessary to temporarily remove the mains and other electrical appliances belonging to the Undertakers from such bridge then the Undertakers shall (and they are hereby authorised to do so) at their own expense temporarily carry their cables and wires across such bridge overhead or at the side thereof in such a manner as will not be a danger or inconvenience to the public or unreasonably interfere with the works to be carried out by the county council.
- (3) When the rebuilding altering widening or repairing of such bridge shall have been completed the Undertakers shall have the same rights and powers with regard to such bridge and its approaches as they had before the works were carried out.
- (4) If any dispute arises between the county council and the Undertakers with regard to this section the same shall be determined by an arbitrator to be appointed on the application of either party by the Board of Trade.
